This half term, we have re-introduced a few extra curricular activities, Dodgeball to Years 3 and 4 (Monday and Tuesday after school) and 'Golden Mile' to Year 6 (Wednesday at 8:20am).

## Our plans for activities over the next few weeks are listed below (letters about some of these will follow, i.e. booking a lunch for the picnic):

- ⇒ **29th June: Transition session**-your child's next teacher will move down for a session with their 'new class' in the morning (so pupils stay in their own rooms and use their own equipment).
- ⇒ **Week of July 6th: Sports Week:** each class will take part in 'sports day style' races, rather than the annual school sports day. The cup will be awarded to the winning 'House Team' afterwards.
- ⇒ **Week of July 12th: Picnic Week:** each class will have a picnic as a treat on the field (letter to follow with option of school providing lunch instead)
- ⇒ 19th July: Y6 Chevin walk
- ⇒ **20th July: Y6 picnic and play** on the field
- ⇒ **20th July: Ice-cream van** visiting school-ice cream or lolly for each child in school
- ⇒ **20th July: Class parties** for Reception-Y5 (non-uniform treat for **all** children)
- ⇒ **21st July: 9:15am-Y6 Leavers assembly** (Y6 parents to join via Microsoft Teams -invite to follow); followed by shirt and autograph book sign-

ing; and clapping out (see separate details).


